

## SIGHTS IN KENTUCKY.

### Prehistoric Ruins That Have Been Recently Discovered.

Quite a curiosity, which has caused considerable talk, has been discovered five miles from Russellville, Ky. On a high, cliffy, miniature mountain, so thickly overgrown with cedars as to render the passage of human beings almost impossible, was accidentally discovered what is supposed to have once been a city. Here and there for several hundred yards in every direction were found the half-buried ruins of what were once the homes of a people of whom we know nothing. A stone quarry close at hand showed evidence of having been worked in the long ago, and from its capacious bosom the material with which the houses had been constructed was taken. The most wonderful thing seen was the one building, which has stood the storms of ages and is still intact and good for centuries more. It is a square building about 30x40 feet, and is built of huge blocks of stone, which are fully ten feet long by five feet wide in the foundation, and grow smaller higher up, until at the top, thirty-five feet from the ground, the capstones will measure about three feet square. The unanimous opinion of all who have visited the ruins is that this must have been built and used as a fort by the inhabitants of the town in the time of danger.—*St. Louis Globe-Democrat.*
